SERMON NOTES

- I. Jesus provided evidence, joy, and assurance.
- II. Instead of shaming uncertainty, Jesus chose to show up.

FOR DISCUSSION AND REFLECTION

- Why do you think it was important for the disciples to see Jesus' scars when He appeared with them? How might you have responded to His injuries?
- Did Thomas lack faith when telling the other disciples about his uncertainty? Why or why not?
- Why was it important for Jesus to respond to Thomas with evidence of His resurrection?
- What role does the church have in passing on the evidence, joy, and assurance of Jesus Christ? What is your part in that?
- What doubt do you feel like God is inviting you to bring to Him today? How do you hope God will respond?
- What is God saying to you through today's scripture?





Scripture of the Week John 2.:19-31

That Sunday evening the disciples were meeting behind locked doors because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders. Suddenly, Jesus was standing there among them! "Peace be with you," he said. 20 As he spoke, he showed them the wounds in his hands and his side. They were filled with joy when they saw the Lord! 21 Again he said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you." 22 Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. 23 If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven. If you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." One of the twelve disciples, Thomas (nicknamed the Twin), was not with the others when Jesus came. They told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he replied, "I won't believe it unless I see the nail wounds in his hands, put my fingers into them, and place my hand into the wound in his side. Eight days later the disciples were together again, and this time Thomas was with them. The doors were locked; but suddenly, as before, Jesus was standing among them. "Peace be with you," he said. Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and look at my hands. Put your hand into the wound in my side. Don't be faithless any longer. Believe!" "My Lord and my God!" Thomas exclaimed. Then Jesus told him, "You believe because you have seen me. Blessed are those who believe without seeing me." The disciples saw Jesus do many other miraculous signs in addition to the ones recorded in this book. 31 But these are written so that you may continue to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing in him you will have life by the power of his name.

As part of that ongoing effort towards greater accessibility, the St. John's trustees approved the installation of a set of push-button automatic doors for the entryway nearest the worship center. When those doors are unlocked, it's our hope that the push-button entry will be a helpful tool for those who enter in with walkers, wheel-
